Dear Friends of Health Freedom,

Our health freedom journey is not over.

It has been 25 years since we started this journey to secure health freedom in America, and while we've had some successes, many challenges remain. Early on, we helped show the country how to create a "safe harbor" within the practice laws of a state to allow unlicensed health care healers to practice without fear of being charged with "practice of medicine without a license." We exposed some of the toxins such as dental mercury, fluoride added to drinking water and aluminum as an adjuvant in vaccines. The lack of informed consent for these toxins made them a health freedom issue too. With microwave radiation surrounding us, that exposure is becoming like a mandated toxin also. During the covid years, we were strong-armed into social distancing, closures of schools and businesses, and ultimately the mandating of covid shots while access to alternative ways of coping with covid were shut off. It leaves us wondering: what's next?

We know we need to be vigilant and ready to deal with whatever is next; efforts to infringe on our rights are surely not over. We need all of you as we continue on in the effort to stay free. Thank you for being part of our effort!




PROTECTING THE FUTURE OF HEALTH FREEDOM

Right to Refuse by the numbers in 2024. Progress is being made for health freedom across the nation.

Medical mandates regarding vaccinations and health decisions have resulted in coercion for many people. Since 2020, NHFC attorneys have been researching and tracking legislation aimed at protecting bodily autonomy and genetic integrity. The numbers tell a story of progress:

49 states across the nation have filed over 1380 bills that explicitly PROTECT bodily autonomy. 29 states have passed a total of 83 new laws, 8 new laws were passed in 2024!

While progress is being made, many states still lack protective legislation. In these areas, coercive medical mandates persist, making our work to educate and support advocacy groups more critical than ever.

NEW! Expanded Care Practice Act 2025


This year, NHFC's legal team updated the Expanded Practice Act Model Bill, now titled the Expanded Care Practice Act 2025 for Licensed Health Care Occupations. This model legislation aims to:

- Allow licensed medical professionals to use expanded practices beyond prevailing standards of care.
- Be in effect when treatments pose no greater risk than conventional methods.
- Require practitioners to disclose their training, the nature of expanded practices, and obtain informed consent from patients.

This Act empowers licensed practitioners to innovate and offer diverse healing options, while ensuring safety and transparency.

NHFC: Protecting Homeopathic Remedies

NHFC intensified its efforts to safeguard access to homeopathic remedies in 2024. With regulatory pressures mounting, our attorneys collaborated with national organizations to educate legislators and the public about the importance of preserving this time-tested approach to healing. NHFC created a special video to share with the public on Homeopathic Remedies and the Law.

NHFC, and it's sister organization NHFA, recommend the federal law be changed to acknowledge that homeopathic remedies are "generally regarded as safe" with the burden of proof on the government to show harm before any action is taken against them.

NHFA has drafted federal legislation to address this issue and wants to work with any group who shares the same vision to make sure that all homeopathic remedies may be on the market.

 November 2024 - Julie Booras gave a presentation titled Protecting the Future of Health Freedom.

MHA Annual Conference, Northwest Academy of Homeopathy - Edina, MN - November 2024 - Presentations were given by NHFC founders Jerri Johnson, Diane Miller and Leo Cashman.

- Jerri spoke about the history of the health freedom movement in Minnesota as it developed in the mid-1990s.
- Diane presented on the legal and regulatory issues for homeopathy in America.
- Leo spoke on breakthroughs of dental amalgam mercury being currently banned in almost all of Europe and on a federal district court judge's verdict finding that water fluoridation presents an "unreasonable risk of harm" to the brains and nervous systems of children in America.

NHFC is educating people about important issues that affect our health freedoms:

In 2024, National Health Freedom Coalition (NHFC) published a series of insightful and impactful articles each week, offering expert analysis and updates on critical health freedom issues. Our team of writers, including Diane Miller, Leo Cashman, and Steven O'Connor, contributed thought-provoking perspectives on a range of topics shaping the health freedom movement.

Diane Miller's writings, including "Walking Towards Truth and Freedom Requires Critically Thinking Minds" and "Cattle Baron History Repeating Itself, But Now with Human Herds," emphasized the importance of wisdom, historical context, and critical thinking.

She also penned a heartfelt

"Letter to Children and Grandchildren about Freedom and Health," reminding future generations of the value of preserving health freedoms. Throughout her work, Diane highlighted the need to stay true to the vision of health freedom while navigating contemporary challenges.





Leo Cashman kept our readers informed on the ongoing fluoride trials and the controversy surrounding public water

fluoridation. His coverage, including "As Fluoride Trial Wraps Up, EPA Defends its Inaction Citing 'Scientific Uncertainty'" and "The



Fluoride Verdict: A Final Victory or a Scandal That is Buried?", shed light on the ongoing legal

and scientific battles, emphasizing the need for transparency and accountability in public health decisions.



NHFC attorney Steven O'Connor, brought a legal perspective to NHFC's coverage, offering updates on key court rulings

and highlighting critical legal victories that support individual rights and bodily autonomy. His ongoing exploration of state powers



and the Right to Refuse legislative initiative provided essential guidance for grassroots

advocates working to pass state laws that protect personal health decisions.

Together, these contributions helped NHFC educate and inspire activists, advocates, and citizens to take action in protecting health freedom.
