Dear Friends of Health Freedom,

In 2025, the National Health Freedom Coalition continued to stand in the gap for practitioners and consumers. Together with you, we stayed focused on safeguarding our inherent God-given rights to bodily autonomy, informed consent, and access to holistic and complementary care. The climate is really changing. Leaders at both state and federal levels are challenging long-held assumptions. More people are realizing mandates are too restrictive. It is exciting and encouraging to see conversations happening now that have not ever happened in the past.

Throughout the year, NHFC attorneys and staff supported state leaders working on Safe Harbor practitioner exemption bills and other health freedom policies, building on years of coaching groups on legislative strategy and model language. We continued to track and analyze Right to Refuse-style efforts to protect bodily autonomy and genetic integrity, and we consulted with advocates in Vermont, Connecticut, Florida, and Texas who seek to advance protections for unlicensed practitioners and to resist coercive medical mandates. NHFC leaders also represented health freedom at national conferences, sharing our legal expertise on Safe Harbor, EMFs, licensure, and the broader landscape of health freedom law.

Financially, 2025 was a sober year. We mourned the loss of a major funder, and dealt with monthly operating losses. Yet, in a testament to our community’s resilience, we saw other committed donors step up with generous gifts. New relationships were formed to continue our work. We are seeking continued and increasing support from current donors, and seeking new long-term donors. Our work is so important! Thank you to each of you that are supporting NHFC’s health freedom work in big and small ways!

Through it all, we remain clear about our mission: to protect the freedom of every person to make their own health decisions, without coercion, and to access the practitioners and products they deem best for their healing journeys. Over twenty-five years into this work, NHFC continues to offer model legislation, legal analysis, and strategic coaching to citizens who are standing for freedom in their own states. Thank you for walking with us, for your courage in these unsettled times, and for your unwavering belief that health freedom is a right that belongs to us by the laws of God and nature. It is an honor to stand beside you.

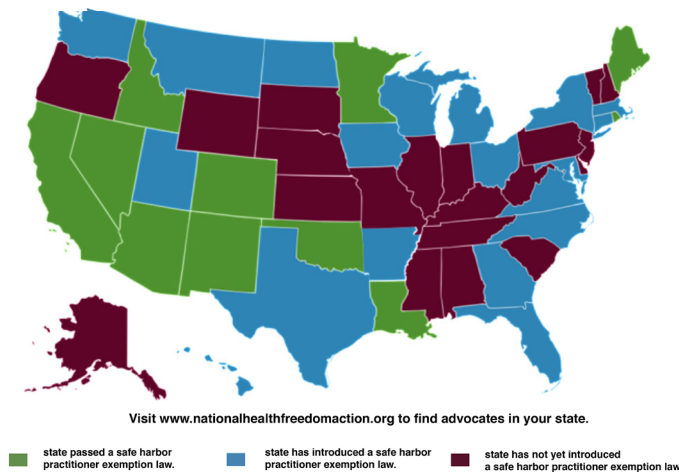

Safe Harbor Practitioner Exemption Laws Protect Consumer Access to Practitioners

In 2025, NHFC continued nationwide education on Safe Harbor Practitioner Exemption laws, a legislative framework that helps ensure consumer access to complementary and alternative health care practitioners while supporting transparency, informed consent, and accountability.

Educational outreach occurred with active or emerging groups in multiple states across all regions of the country. NHFC also provided education and analysis in states where existing practitioner protections faced regulatory or administrative pressure, helping communities understand how access can be preserved through lawful, freedom-based approaches.

Currently eleven states have passed a safe harbor practitioner exemption law in some form, including: Minnesota, Rhode Island, California, Louisiana, Idaho, Oklahoma, Arizona (for homeopaths), New Mexico, Colorado, Nevada and Maine.

Progress for health freedom continues to grow across the nation. Here are Right to Refuse by Highlights in 2025:

Medical mandates tied to vaccines, employment, education, and personal health decisions have placed many Americans under intense pressure and coercion. Since 2020, NHFC attorneys have researched, tracked, and supported legislation designed to protect bodily autonomy, informed consent, and genetic integrity. The numbers below reflect the growing movement to safeguard these fundamental rights.

49 states across the nation have filed over **1500** bills that explicitly **PROTECT** bodily autonomy.

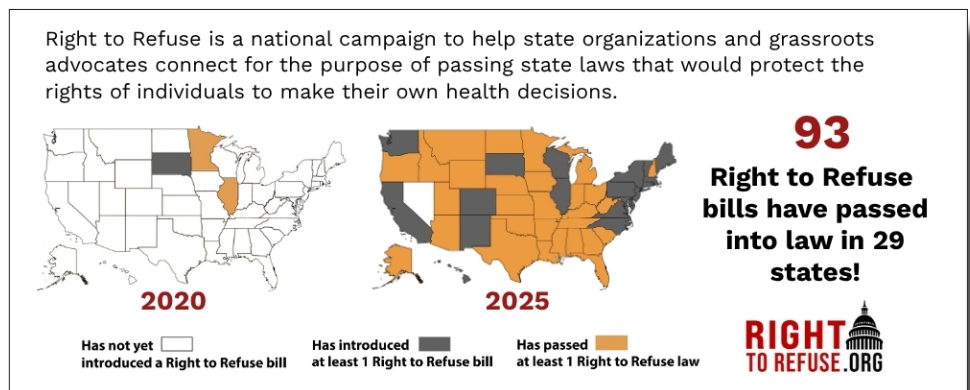
29 states have passed a total of **93** new laws, plus **9** resolutions.

10 new laws were passed in **2025!**

While progress is being made, many states still lack protective legislation. In these areas, coercive medical mandates persist, making our work to educate and support advocacy groups more critical than ever.

NHFC Attorney Steven O'Connor educated state groups working on **Right to Refuse legislation through a series of impactful presentations and resources.**

Momentum Builds for Expanded Care Practice Act

NHFC continued advancing education around the **Expanded Care Practice Act** model, which outlines how **licensed health care professionals can responsibly offer expanded and integrative approaches which are typically outside of their standards of care while maintaining patient safety and informed consent.**

2025 educational efforts included:

- Updating and recording educational materials explaining the Expanded Care Practice model framework
- Conducting multi-state statutory research to identify best practices
- Reviewing medical discipline cases to inform practitioner risk awareness

Core principles emphasized include:

- Freedom to practice outside prevailing standards of care
- No greater risk than conventional treatment
- Reasonable skill and safety
- Full disclosure and informed consent
